Artist's Statement

I was born in Halifax Nova Scotia on Canada's East Coast of Scottish-Irish lineage on my father's side and Métis (French Canadian -Cree Indian)-American/Dutch heritage on my mother's side. I began painting and drawing as a youth under the influence of my mother, herself an accomplished painter. My family moved to Vancouver, British Columbia, when I was 10 years old and I continued painting and drawing throughout my teens as I took a B Sc in Biochemistry and an MBA and proceeded in a career in business. Later I studied painting and visual art at the Emily Carr University of the Arts graduating with a B A in visual arts/painting. I have studied extensively at the Art students League in New York City.

In terms of my work which ranges from seascape and mountains cape to figurative and portraiture I have worked in oil, acrylic and watercolour. My primary influences have been at various stages the Canadian Group of Seven, Edward Hopper, Lucien Freud and some of my Canadian and American instructors.

I view myself as a narrative painter by which I mean my paintings are a single frame in a much bigger story with a start and an end. I see painting in somewhat the same light as I see jazz and classical music and good food (I am a bit of an amateur chef). It must be spontaneous yet substantive...it must be wholesome yet spicy ... it must be a treat to the eye and oblivious to financial value. Currently I plan to document the coast of British Columbia in a series of moderate sized paintings some of which I will bring to Antibes this summer.
